AGENDA: DISCUSSING THE AEGEAN SEA DISPUTE

The Aegean Sea dispute primarily involves Greece and Turkey, centering on issues of sovereignty and rights over territorial waters, airspace, and natural resources in the Aegean Sea. Key points of contention include the delineation of territorial waters, where Greece seeks to extend its waters from 6 to 12 nautical miles, which Turkey opposes, fearing it would limit its access and control. Additionally, both nations dispute the airspace, with conflicting claims over Flight Information Regions (FIRs) and national airspace limits. The dispute also encompasses the continental shelf and Exclusive Economic Zones (EEZs), particularly regarding rights to explore and exploit underwater resources like oil and gas. Historical tensions, national pride, and strategic interests compound the complexity of these issues.

Over the next three days delegates will have to navigate through these complexities and strive for a resolution.



Concurrently, adjustments to the appointment process of the Chief Election Commissioner aimed to foster transparency and meritocracy in selection.



Founded in 1954, the Bilderberg Committee has grown into a significant platform where world leaders, business magnates, and policymakers convene to discuss pressing issues, such as the advancement of artificial intelligence (AI). Currently, the group leads discussions on the ethical implications, legal frameworks, and international collaboration in AI research and development, recognizing its substantial and escalating impact, akin to kindling, potentially sparking the next world war.

The Bilderberg Conference is responsible for shaping the trajectory of artificial intelligence by leveraging its influence on international agreements, fostering cross-border collaboration, and steering policy initiatives.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

- o The dates of the conference are the 10th, 11th and 12th of July, 2024. Registrations are open for students of grades VIII-XII.
- o The registration fee is ₹1,200/- per delegate as part of a delegation and ₹1,300/- for an Individual Delegate.
- o The minimum number of delegates required for a delegation is 6. Each person can only be part of one delegation.
- o The last date of registration is 26th June, 2024.
- o During the conference participants must be dressed in an appropriate manner, with the dress code of western business formals (unless specified otherwise).
- o Electronic devices such as phones, laptops and tablets are allowed. However, use of the internet in committee is not allowed.
- o Use of unparliamentary language during the conference is prohibited. Delegates should exhibit exemplary behaviour.
- o Any incident of bullying or harassment will lead to immediate disqualification.
- o The decisions of the secretariat and executive board are final and binding, and all participants are required to respect the same.
- o By registering, the participants are agreeing to the aforementioned rules. Any violation of the rules and regulations may lead to disqualification and expulsion from the conference.
